Just prior to WW II this plane was being folded in England. Showed up in USA during WW II (as best I can find). I can track it in Japan at least just at the end of the war based on information from my only Japanese contact who was making them at that time. With its origami folds and bird like appearance where is it's origin? Any information let me know. Americans soon changed nose to match nose shown in my Classic Acro which flies just as well but lose the bird look.

Note: Red lines are for folds, blue lines indicate existing creases, and green lines represent hidden edges.



Step 12
Pinch Points 3 and 4 along Lines H and I as shown. Fold formed nose up. Flatten well.

Step 14
Fold top point down as shown.

Step 15

Fold along centerline approximately to this shape:
